amphibians Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow

older. They have smooth, slimy skin.

birds All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.

fish Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to

help them swim and they breathe through gills.

Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and mammals

feed on their mother's milk as a baby.

All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin. reptiles

Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores. carnivore

herbivore Animals that only eat plants are herbivores.

Animals that eat both plants omnivore
