Knowledge Building Blocks

Pupils should know:

- ❖ The good news is not just about setting an example for good behaviour and challenging bad behaviour; it is that Jesus offers a way to heal the damage done by human sin.
- ❖ Christians see that Jesus' teachings and example cut across expectations, e.g. The Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus' values favour serving the weak and vulnerable, and not making people comfortable.
- ❖ Christians believe that they should bring this good news to life in the world in different ways, within their church family in their personal lives, with family, with neighbours in the local, national and global community.

Key Knowledge

Jesus taught us 'To love God and love your neighbours, among others, guide Christian live.




The parable of 'The wise and foolish build' is a parable told by Jesus telling people to listen to his advice. Christians should build their lives on strong foundations by following the teachings and examples set by Jesus. Love and be kind to everyone around you.

'Sermon on the Mount' is a speech that Jesus gave, teaching his followers the Lord's Prayer and several parables. He taught God's laws, which he expected his followers to uphold.

'A healing miracle' is a story where Jesus was able to heal a man without even seeing him because the man had faith. It teaches Christians to help others and have faith.

- National**  - Those of a common nation.

- Sermon**  - A talk or written account about a religious or moral subject (often based on a religious text).
- Commandments**  - Rules of conduct, Laws.
- Miracle**  - An extraordinary event attributed to something supernatural.
- Transformation**  - A dramatic change in form or appearance.
- Sacrament**  - A religious ceremony or act within Christianity. An outward sign of inner feelings e.g. Holy Communion.
- Discipleship**  - Those following a leader or teacher.
