commitment to living a life as a Christian. Holy water is used as a symbol of being cleansed and made ready for a new life for God.





Some Hindu communities have a **Sacred Thread** ceremony for boys to show they are ready to take on religious responsibilities.

Bar Mitzvah is when a Jewish child reaches an age where they take responsibility for themselves. They read from the Torah, in Hebrew publicly in the synagogue. The ceremony is usually followed by a party involving food, music and dancing. It is expected for a boy to give a speech at the do to mark his new status as a man.
