



GEOGRAPHY Year: 2 Term: Summer 1 National Curriculum/Topic: Let's Explore London? Why is London the capital city of England? **Depth Enquiry Question:**

Geographical Skills/Knowledge Coverage:

- Develop knowledge about the world, the United Kingdom and their locality. •
- Understand basic subject-specific vocabulary related to human and physical geography.
- Use maps and a globe to identify the continents and the 5 oceans.
- Understand that the terms 'continent' and 'sea'.
- Understand that both a map and a globe show the same thing.
- Use maps and globes to locate the U.K.
- Use technology such as Google Maps and Google Earth to find and locate the U.K.
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the 4 countries and capital cities of the U.K emphasis on London.

•	Understand the similarities and difference through studying the human and physical geography of
	London and comparing to own local area. Express own views about a place, people and the
	environment.

- Be able to explain orally and in writing the similarities and differences between the features of the two localities - local area and London.
- Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in London and how they affect people's activities and dress.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to physical features of London: river, soil, season, weather and human features: city, factory, house, office, shops, parks, famous landmarks etc.
- To use maps to identify key human and physical features of London.
- To use compass points and directional language to navigate between London landmarks and locations. •

Possible Activities:

- Use atlases to locate the UK and then London on a map. Use a map of London or photographs and use • geographical vocab to describe some of its main features – Label Rivers, parks and shops etc.
- Learn facts about some of London's most famous landmarks and locate on a map. Write facts files on a chosen landmark.
- Use compass directions (NESW) and right, left to give directions between locations/landmarks in London.
- Compare natural and manmade features in Malvern and London identify similarities and differences.
- Learn about seasonal weather patterns in London and consider how to dress appropriately depending on • the season – how does it affect what you do?
- Express opinions about where they would prefer to live Malvern or London? And give reasons why. List • pros and cons.
- Create a poster for tourists all about London and its attractions.

Vocabulary:

city, town, capital city

River Thames, Hyde Park, St James Park, forests, parks, hills, streets, motorways flats, tower blocks, houses

Landmarks – Buckingham Palace, London Eye, Trafalgar Square etc. North, east, south and west – left, right, straight on
