

In this unit about Our Local Area children in Year I will:

- > To name and locate the seven continents and five oceans
- \succ To name and locate the 4 countries and capital cities of the UK and it surrounding seas
- ▶ To locate Malvern and its surrounding area on a map including nearby towns and cities such as Worcester, Gloucester,
- Birmingham, Upton, Ledbury etc.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to name key physical features of their local area e.g. hills, farm, forest, river, valley, commons etc. and key human features e.g. town, city, village, factory, farm, house, shop etc.
- To describe their locality using words and pictures.
- To learn their address and be able to tell someone
- > Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries as well their own local area.
- Use aerial photographs to recognise landmarks in their local area and also of the school and basic human and physical features of the local area such as shops, houses, stations etc.
- > Devise simple maps of the school and surrounding area and use and construct basic symbols in a key.
- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds.
- Ask geographical questions about own locality e.g. What is it like to live in this area? What do you like/dislike about Malvern?
- Express own views about a place i.e. their own locality
- Observe and record e.g. rooms within the school or buildings on a local street Record using a range of techniques such as
- ▶ drawing, pictograms, memory maps, simple maps, sketches, labelled diagrams etc.
