Pupils should know:


- Christians believe God is Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- A Christians believe The Father creates; he sends the Son who saves his people; the Son sends the Holy Spirit to his followers.
- Christians find that understanding God is challenging; people spend their whole lives learning more and more about God.
- Christians really want to try to understand God better and so try to describe God using symbols, similes and metaphors, in song, story, poems and art.
- Christians worship God as Trinity. It is a huge idea to grasp and Christians have created art to help to express this belief.
- Christians believe the Holy Spirit is God's power at work in the world and in their lives today, enabling them to follow Jesus.



Christians believe that Jesus was not just a good man but God who has come to Earth to rescue humanity.

A Gospel from the very beginning of Jesus' life shares the trinity, where God announces Jesus as the Son and Holy Spirit.

Christians believe God is three in one: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.





The trinity is an important part of prayers and baptism ceremonies.



Baptism is a ceremony that shows they have become part of the Christian family.

Jesus was baptised too.

Holy water, which has been blessed, is used as a symbol to cleanse the person from sin.
