The Golden Rule:
Treat others the way
You want to be treated.

People do not have to be religious to want to be good. Humanists do not believe in a good. They believe it is possible to live a good and fulfilling life without following a traditional religion. They often follow the Golden Rule. The Golden rule is important in many traditions; religious and non-religious.
