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

#### **Parking**

This is a polite reminder to parents to ensure that you are parking with thought outside school and remembering not to block neighbours driveways or park illegally on corners or zig-zag lines. This week we had some Community Support Officers survey the area while on their duty and they were asking parents to consider their parking. We were disappointed to hear that some parents were rude to them and challenging their requests. The Community Support Officers work to keep the public safe and when they are outside schools their priority are your children and our pupils. We have had very near misses with pupils especially when cars are parked in obscure places and block the view of other drivers and therefore putting lives at risk. The PSCO's will be back to monitor the area, so please be mindful of your parking and keeping your children safe when on the path and crossing the road.

St Matthias will be providing families eligible for Free School Meals with food vouchers during the 2 week Christmas break. These will be provided via **email** using 'Edenred,' a Government scheme. #### **Year 1 History Trip to The Commandery**

Year 1 had an action-packed day at The Commandery in Worcester on Thursday! We travelled back in time and experienced what it would be like to be a soldier during the Civil War. Children were invited to hold weapons which Musketeers and Cavaliers would have used (they were extremely heavy), look at the clothing they would have worn in battle and also tested out the helmets!! One of the helmets had a dual purpose for the soldiers and if they turned it upside down, they used it as a cooking pot!!

We then held a real pike and looked at (blunted) spears, it took 4 children to hold it! To prepare for battle, we had a training session in the Courtyard Garden and practised commands to hold our very own pikes and stand in formation! All children followed the instructions brilliantly and amazed staff by their superb listening skills.

Next, we learnt how to fire a cannon and work in a firing team! Each child had a special role. We learnt that soldiers were not called by their Christian name but by their job! We had Officer Worm, Officer Wet Mop, Officer Dry Mop, Officer Powder Monkey, Officer Ram-rod, Captain and the Fuse Master!

After our tiring battle, we had a tour around the centre and saw some very interesting pictures and enjoyed moving figures on the interactive battlefield. We spotted King Charles at the top of the Cathedral's tower, looking for the enemy!

For our afternoon adventure, we walked up a spiral pathway to the top of Fort Royal, which was a battlefield during the Civil War. At the top we could see the Cathedral and also the Malvern Hills!

Finally, we spent time looking at different artefacts people would have had during this period in history. Our day was very busy with lots of new facts to learn. Many children had a snooze on the way home!!

I think Year One would thoroughly recommend this trip to families as well as other Year One classes in the future!

#### **Attendance Update - Lateness**

We know that sometimes things don't go to plan in the morning and unexpected circumstances can cause people to be late. However, it is very important for children to be in class promptly at the start of every day and ready to learn. Our staff ensure that they are punctual and on time for work every day, ready to welcome your children into school and get lessons started without delay. When children are late, they miss the introduction of the lesson and find it harder to get on with their independent work as a result. It also disrupts the learning of the other children when latecomers are entering the classroom in the middle of a lesson.

Following recent updates from Worcestershire Children First, we are currently amending our attendance policy to ensure we secure the best possible attendance for all children. One of the updates we are making is to our 'Lates' procedure.

From Monday 13th December we will be using the following codes on our register:

Children arriving **between 9am and 9.15am** will be marked as **Late** (L code) and the number of minutes late will be recorded and totalled up over the term.

Children arriving **after 9.15am** will receive an **Unauthorised Late** (U code) and this will affect your child's overall attendance %.

Any child with 12 or more 'U' marks in a 12-week period may mean we are required to involve the Education Welfare Service and potentially take further action.

If you know that your child is often late for school, please try some of the following ideas to help improve punctuality and help improve your child's attainment and progress:



If your bus is often late, try catching the earlier bus or using alternative transport to ensure you will be on time. If it isn't too far, consider walking to school, especially when the weather is dry.



Traffic during school-run times is often busy – could you walk to school instead? If not, try leaving a few minutes earlier so that your child is in school on time.



If you find you are often just a few minutes late, please leave home slightly earlier to allow for unexpected hold ups on your way.



Set your alarm slightly earlier – if your child is often 10 minutes late, set the alarm 10 minutes earlier to allow them enough time to get to school before 9am.



Reward and praise your children when they get ready quickly in the morning and arrive on time for school. It helps everyone in the family to have a good start to the day if you aren't having to chase children up to get them ready for school!

Being on time for school, and later in life, being on time for work is an important life skill. In the workplace, it is common for employers to expect their staff to arrive on time for work. Helping your child to develop good attitudes towards punctuality will help them now and as they get older. If you are having trouble getting your child to school on time, please speak to their class teacher or to Mrs Kazerooni to see how we can help you.

#### **Parent Questionnaire Feedback**

Thank you to all the parents who completed our parent questionnaire this term. Here are some of the results... 93% agreed/strongly agreed that their child was happy at St Matthias

92% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias makes sure its pupils are well behaved

39% had not experienced bullying, 41% agreed/strongly agreed bullying was dealt with effectively, 15% were neutral= 95%

85% agreed/strongly agreed that they were aware of what their child was learning

97% agreed/strongly agreed that communication was effective

24% had no concerns and 68% agreed/strongly agreed that their concerns dealt with properly= 92%

93% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias had high expectations

93% agreed/strongly agreed that their child did well at St Matthias

95% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias helped parents to support their child's learning

87% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias supported their child's wider personal development

90% agreed/strongly agreed that there was a good range of subjects available

83% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias prepared their child for the future

98% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias is well led and managed

92% agreed/strongly agreed that they would recommend St Matthias to another parent.

We were overwhelmingly grateful for the positive comments and suggestions we received and will take on board many of the suggestions to ensure that we continue to improve St Matthias for the good of your children. Thank you.





#### **Attendance**

There are 365 days in a calendar year, 175 of them are not school days – that's plenty of time for shopping, days out, parties, holidays, appointments and visiting family and friends.

Good attendance means being in school over 96% of the time. In a school year, that means being in school on 183 out of the 190 school days. The table below shows class attendance statistics for this week.
