#### Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

end to your Science unit on Electricity!

It is always exciting to be invited to a class to share in their learning. Year 6 tracked me down at the end of last week to show me their electric 'wire loop games.' You will have seen these types of games before where you have to follow the wire with a loop and try not to touch the wire, if you do it makes a loud buzz or lights a bulb. The Year 6 worked in teams, applied their knowledge of electrical circuits, currents and conductors to make their own 'wire loop game' in order to challenge a person to not set the buzzer/light off! Each game was very different in style and I managed to complete a few with great concentration! Well done Year 6, a good

Staying with the Science theme, Year 5 went on a 'life cycle hunt' in the school grounds this week to see if they could find evidence of living things at different stages of their life cycles.





Year 4 have also started learning about electricity; they investigated complete and incomplete circuits, made predictions and then tested them. They found that the bulb lit up when the circuit was complete as the electric current could flow. This is important knowledge which will be needed when you get to Year 6 and start applying it to different projects!



Year 3 enjoyed keeping active with our new coach Jordan, playing attack/defence games. Their aim was to get to the other side of the playground without getting tagged!

Year 2 have begun their Science topic on 'Plants,' they have started by planting some salad vegetables to grow and look after. I am very pleased that you have labelled your seeds clearly so you know which ones are which as you see them evolve! I wonder if we will get to taste them too!



Year 1 had a wonderful start to their History topic exploring the question - 'Is an Ipad more fun than the toys your grandparents played with?' They were very lucky to be able to explore old style dolls houses, string puppets, old dolls and old baby activity centres. They showed these old items great respect and carefully investigated how they were played with. I wonder how they will answer their big question?

Reception have been learning lots of new sounds again this week, they investigated 'oa' by designing their own coats and exploring what floats using lots of boats. Then they read lots of 'oa' words and matched them with pictures and wrote them on the board.









Nursery work on lots of concepts and every day they play 'Concept Cat'. One concept they explored this week was the word 'large.' They made a large circle together by holding hands and created large piles of bricks to understand what the word large meant.

Following the Parent Questionnaire in November last year, we noted that parents wanted more information about what the children were learning. In response to this, teachers are sharing learning over the week on the ClassDojo, Class Story Page, but we are also sharing 'Knowledge Organisers' for subjects such as Science, Geography, History and RE with parents. These are being uploaded to our School Website, under 'Our Learning' in the 'Class Page' area as a resource to give you information about learning and the key vocabulary being introduced. We hope you will find this useful and another way to find out about what your child is learning. The Knowledge Organisers are also being shared over the next few weeks by the teachers on ClassDojo, so please look out for them. Have a lovely weekend, Mrs Beale

#### **Online Safety**

Going online, talking to friends and playing online games is a huge part of young people's lives. Therefore, it is really important to talk to your children about online safety. In school we talk about eSafety through our computing lessons and PSHE lessons and whenever a child experiences a problem. We can educate and inform children on how to deal with situations where they might feel uncomfortable. If something upsets them or if they don't know what to do, we ALWAYS tell them to speak to an adult; this could be in school or at home. It is also important for adults at home to have regular conversations about being safe online and have parental controls and privacy settings on your child's devices. It is also advisable to check the age guidance on apps and games to ensure that the content is appropriate for your child. Children can find themselves in situations which are out of their control and being able to talk about it to an adult is essential. They can also fall out with their friends which can cause great upset. Monitoring usage, time online, messages and content and talking to your child will encourage them to come to you if they ever need support or advice. Sometimes as a parent we do not know everything about the new apps and games children play online. With this newsletter is an Online Safety: top tips sheet which can point you in the right direction for advice and what to talk about with your children.

Following the parent consultations, everyone will receive a short report of the discussion. If you are unable to make the appointment you will receive the report, however you will not have had the opportunity to discuss it.

If you miss you appointment or do not receive the information you have requested please contact the class teacher in the first instance and then leave a message with the school office.

**Oliver, Y3** has been awarded 'Man of the Match' for being a superb goalie and won a medal! Congratulations!






**Attendance** The table below shows class attendance statistics for **this week**.
