Bring in on Monday 14th February and leave at the front of school.




Parents' Evening

Internet Safety and Mental Health Week

This week was Internet Safety Week and Children's Mental Health Week.

On Tuesday 8th February teachers planned a day of activities to support children's mental health which focused on strategies to promote positive mental health and thinking about people they could talk to if they were feeling anxious or worried. Children learned to think about who supports them to grow and who helps us to

cope with any challenges they face.









Our children also learned a lot about Internet Safety. We had some very special guests to help us learn, as our local Police Officers came in to discuss the safe use of the internet. They started with the West Midlands Regional Cyber Crime Unit for Internet Safety Day 2022 presentation, where the children watched age appropriate online safety advice and promoted the safe and positive use of digital technology for children. The police officers then answered any questions the children had about Internet Safety and spoke at length about age restrictions and the importance of privacy. They even got to discuss what they would do in certain scenarios which could challenge them in the future.














World Book Day 2022
