Thank you for your continued support with testing your child for COVID-19 when they feel ill.

We have had a large rise in cases across the school with both staff and children so we are continuing to be vigilant and following the government guidance. Closing a class due to lack of staffing will be a last resort and we will do our very best to avoid this. We are continuing to advise Lateral Flow testing to identify positive cases, following good hygiene procedures and ventilating classrooms. Accessing home test kits is proving more difficult at the moment so please keep trying, as at times more tests are released for home delivery and persisting is the key. Easter Experience at St Matthias Church 2022

This week every class visited St Matthias Church for the most wonderful Easter Experience. There were six interactive stations placed around the church, each covering key moments of the Easter Story and exploring Holy Week.

The children were fully engaged with the whole experience and learned about the events of Holy Week and it's importance in the run up to Easter. Thank you to everyone involved at St Matthias Church for creating this experience and for the warm welcome.

The journey began with Palm Sunday, children were asked to write a 'hope' on a stone which symbolises the hope that Jesus gave as he rode into Jerusalem on the back of the donkey, as many people cheered and waved palm leaves.



At the second station, children learnt about Jesus - the Servant King. They heard how Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, which was a job of servants not kings. Jesus wanted to show that he was not too important to wash their feet and to do as he had done. Instead of washing feet, children were invited to use the water to make the symbol of the cross and their hand.



Next, children experienced the Last Supper and were asked to share a special object which helps them to remember someone who is important to them. The children were then told that Jesus asked his disciples to eat bread and remember his body. He also asked them to remember his blood as they drank wine. Children had some bread to eat to remember Jesus.



After The Last Supper, we learnt that Jesus and his friends went to the garden to pray but his friends fell asleep and Jesus was alone. The children were asked to think about how they feel when they are alone and to make something that scares them using Play doh. The children then placed these in the garden to help them not be afraid of it anymore.



After visiting the garden, the children went to see the cross which had a red scarf wrapped around it and a crown of thorns. The children heard how some of the soldiers made bets using dice to win Jesus' clothes. They also heard how Jesus was teased because he was not wearing a royal robe or a nice crown; some didn't believe that he was the Son of God.



Finally, the children arrived at the empty tomb and discovered that Jesus had risen. This proved that Jesus was the Son of God. To celebrate new life, the church gave every child an Easter egg to remember the celebratory end to Holy Week.




Easter Bonnet Parade- Thursday 7th April 2022 9.00am


Outside Achievements
