Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back after the special May half term and I hope you all got to enjoy some of the Jubilee celebrations which went on in the community last week.



External Review

This week we had our Summer Term external review and received another very positive report reflecting the progress we are continuing to make as a school. Since joining our Trust in March 2020 a National Leader of Education (NLE) has visited our school to complete a termly external review. The NLE speaks to the Senior Leadership Team, reviews the progress which has been made within the term and completes a learning walk visiting all classrooms. This prepares our school for when Ofsted visit and we receive our first Ofsted rating as a school, since joining The Spire Learning Trust.

The review focused on some key Ofsted current criteria which included attendance, Early Reading, Governance and writing. The NLE noted the excellent learning behaviours of the children who were focused and engaged in their lessons, contributing fully to the activities presented to them and particularly some of the improvements in writing.

Early Reading is always an important focus of the visits as Phonics and being able to decode words for reading is an important life skill for children's development of knowledge and love of reading. As you know we have invested this year in a new Systematic Synthetic Phonics programme called Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) which was introduced in March and the NLE was impressed as we showed him the huge impact of this new DfE approved scheme in the children's writing and reading in the Early Years and KS1.

Our Governors have continued to monitor the progress of the school through Sub-Committee meetings and Full Governing Body meetings. The Governors also complete their own reviews of the school and have a learning walk in the diary for the end of June. The Governors form a large part of our school and ensure that we are making progress for the good of the children at St Matthias. They monitor, challenge and meet regularly to review the schools targets and progress. If anyone would like to be part of the Governing Body or knows anyone in the community who would like to become a Governor, our Chair of Governors, Mrs Liz Bessant, is always willing to discuss what it entails.

We were very pleased with our positive feedback from the review and I wanted to share a big thank you to the children for sharing their learning with our visitor and the staff for their dedication to making a difference and supporting your children to Aspire, Believe and Achieve. You make me so proud!

Bell Boating (photographs on the next page!)

Years 5 and 6 took part in a NEW activity for St Matthias, this week, hopefully this will become a regular event! They went off to Fladbury village, where the River Avon flows through, to have a great day on the water! Designed by Olympic Canoe Coach, David Train, the Bell Boat is a totally unique design in watercraft, its purpose is to remove the fear of taking part in paddle sport and to help with team work and cooperation. Bell Boats are 9 metres long and 1.4 metres wide. Its twin hull design with central non-slip deck seats up to 8 adults or 12 children with a helm. The benefit of the stable design removed the fear from having a go. The Year 5's and 6's each had an adult with them on the Bell Boat and they worked in a team to steer and paddle the boat along the River Avon and even negotiated the locks. They had an amazing experience and the groups were led by Andy Train who commented on how well behaved and polite our children were!




