






ClassDojo

ClassDojo is a wonderful way for teachers to share information about the curriculum and photographs of your children learning at school. It has also been a super way to contact your class teachers to update them with a quick message without needing to make a call or speak on the playground. However, recently some staff have had complaints and rather rude and aggressive



messages sent to them which is not what ClassDojo is for. Our staff always have your children's best interests at heart, we follow our vision and care about each child. We also have to follow up with behavioural choices which might have gone wrong for some children and our job is also to help children to understand what has happened in a restorative way. So, before sending a message to your class teacher, I ask you to read your message and ensure that it is worded in a polite and respectful manner so as not to offend; this does happen but it is in the minority. I want to thank parents who do send polite messages and keep teachers informed about their children and I thank parents for being respectful. Please remember that children do follow examples from adults so we should all model polite and respectful behaviours.

I have been informed about some rather disturbing games that are coming through on the internet via Tik Tok and You Tube. I strongly urge you, as parents to monitor what your children are watching on the internet and also ensure that the apps and games that your children have are <u>AGE APPROPRIATE</u>. If they are not age appropriate and your children are allowed age 12+ apps then the algorithms within those apps allow inappropriate content to filter through to your children's web browsers and they may then be subjected to disturbing

games and adverts. I do not want to highlight on this newsletter what I have been informed about as if your children read the newsletter and they have not come across this information then it could encourage them to google search.


