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Languages Day- Thank you Mrs Maidens!

We held a special Languages Day on Thursday 7th July to celebrate different cultures and learn to speak a few words in different languages. We welcomed visitors in person and via

zoom; Romanian, Spanish and Arabic speakers and we even had a Deaf guest with his interpreter to teach us British Sign Language! Children took part in a range of activities; from research tasks,

songs, games, art, playing boules, board games and all children learned how to order croissants (and eat them) in our French cafe! During the day we tried speaking in Japanese, Mandarin, German, French, Spanish and Italian. We welcomed visitors from The Chase High School during the afternoon; languages teacher Mrs Bennison taught

some of our KS2 children a Spanish lesson and some of the Chase High School language students read stories to our children.

Our Deaf guest was: David Ellington, a film, theatre and TV actor and presenter. His interpreter was Pascale. They taught us signs for hello, goodbye, thank you, elephant, giraffe, lion/lioness, squirrel, yellow, white, black and tree.

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School reports

Your child's school report will be coming home next week, the report will give you information about your child's progress during this academic year. Following the report there will be an online feedback form for you to complete. If you wish to discuss the report with your child's current teacher you can request a telephone appointment via ClassDojo directly with your class teacher, after the reports have been sent out. In the reports we will send a transition leaflet, attendance information and any Statutory Assessment information your child might have taken part in.

Meet the teacher Day- Monday 18th July

We have our 'Meet the teacher' day on Monday 18th July. So your child can experience a day in their new classroom before the summer holidays. We are aware that some children become anxious about their new class. We are lucky being in a small school as most children will have already met their new teacher and have already started to build a relationship with them. This 'Meet the Teacher' day will enable both your child and the class teacher to get to know each other a little more, know which



room and door they need in September and ask any questions they might have. If your child has SEND needs we are also making a conscious effort to give them the opportunity to meet their class teacher on more than just the transition day, this might be touching base with them over the next few weeks, sending them to show work to their new teacher and the new teacher visiting the class in their current room.

Sports Day Arrangements

Early Years Sports Day Wednesday 13th July

Children in Nursery and Reception will have their Sports Day morning on Wednesday 13th July at 11am. Early Years Parents are welcome to watch and to share in a picnic lunch on the field following the events. You are



welcome to bring your own rugs and chairs. If your child attends an afternoon session you can arrange with the staff to bring them for the morning sporting events so they can take part.

Sports Day Friday 15th July

You will have seen on the dates page, that we are holding a Sports Day for Years 1-6 on our school field this year and can now confirm the arrangements with you, as parents are welcome to attend this year if they wish. As we cannot have the whole school on the field at one time, we have arranged a morning session and an afternoon session for the sporting events.

Years 1, 2 and 3 will have their sporting events from **10.45am -12noon** so parents of children in these classes can attend this session.

Picnic Lunch

Parents of children in Years 1-6 can also attend a <u>picnic lunch between 12-12.45pm</u>. Therefore if your child/ren are taking part in the morning session, parents can stay in the field and the children can join you after their sporting events. Parents of children taking part in the

afternoon session can arrive at 12 noon and take part in the picnic lunch prior to the afternoon session and the children will be brought across to the field to meet you. If you are unable to attend the picnic then your child will stay with staff in school and eat in the school grounds. ALL children who normally have a hot dinner will receive a **packed lunch on this day.**

Parents may bring their own rugs and chairs with them to sit on and their own picnic food. Following the picnic lunch there will be a break from 12.45 and 1pm where all children will return to school for the registers and toilet break before Years 4 - 6 return to the field for their events.

Years 4, 5 and 6 will have their sporting events from **1pm until 2.15pm** so the parents of children in these classes can attend this session.

PARENT toilets – should any parent or non-St Matthias children need the toilet during Sports Day, St Matthias Church has kindly offered their facilities. Any St Matthias child will be escorted to toilets in school by a member of staff if they are on the field. Following Sports Day we will be selling ice-lollies!


