Dear Parents and Carers,

It is hard to think that it was only this week that we all had an extra bank holiday to pay our last respects to Queen Elizabeth II as we said goodbye and watched her state funeral. I am sure lots of you watched it on the television and some of you might have been in the crowds in London to pay your Respects. The sad occasion was certainly an huge historical and special event which will be remembered by many for years to come.



We have had a very busy week and on Tuesday my School Improvement Advisor visited us to discuss our priorities on the School Development Plan for this year and also have a tour of the classrooms. It was wonderful to see busy children right from Nursery to Year 6. I love showing visitors around the school as your children make our school the most special and wonderful place to be. They have super learning behaviours, are eager to share in their learning and are always happy to talk to us as we walk around. Some of our main priorities this year are to develop, deepen and broaden pupils vocabulary, improve editing skills in writing, continue to have high expectations of attitudes to writing and pride in work, publish quality pieces of written work and develop resilience and understanding when applying arithmetic skills to problem solving and reasoning in Maths . This will be achieved by learning a new word a day, thinking about its meaning, word class (noun, adjective, verb) and using the word in their work, by teachers modelling editing skills and expectations in shared writing sessions prior to independent writing sessions where pupils improve their own writing using learned editing techniques. Problem solving and reasoning skills in Maths are very challenging, deciding which Mathematical operation to use and working out what steps are needed to find the answer can often cause confusion, therefore teachers are focusing on high quality modelling of problem solving and reasoning skills, using accurate mathematical language so pupils are able to understand which operations (+,-,x./.) and steps are needed to solve the problem.

Alongside these priorities we still have high expectations of pupil's learning behaviours and attendance. Missing even one day of school can leave a child with gaps in their learning; it is very challenging to catch up when the curriculum moves so quickly.

So please avoid holidays and absences in term time.




















DON'T FORGET School Photographer on MONDAY!

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Harvest Festival

This year, our Harvest Service will be held at St Matthias Church on **Wednesday 5th October** with the pupils, staff, parents and Rev Phillip. We have been practising our harvest songs during worship and thinking about our theme for this year's celebration. We are linking our Harvest Service to our value Thankfulness and also the reign, life and achievements of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

Donations for our Harvest Service will be given to **Malvern Food Bank** who have supported so many local families in our Malvern community. We will collect the donations during the week of

Monday 3rd October. Items which are warmly welcomed are :- tinned food, packet food, toiletries, laundry detergent, tea, coffee, squash, baby wipes, nappies, toilet rolls etc



We have booked the Nasal Flu Immunisations for **Monday 31st October**, the day we return after half term. This is NOT a COVID vaccine, this is for protection against flu.

Children are able to receive a FREE flu immunisation from Reception to Year 6, this is free, painless, quick and side effects are uncommon and generally mild. Now that winter is looming and the children are together in warm classrooms there is always a risk of children catching colds but we want to prevent them passing on flu. Children who have the Flu vaccine are less likely to pass the virus on to friends and family. You will receive a letter next week with some frequently asked questions about the vaccine, which is given in school by trained nurses.

In previous years we have given a pack to parents with a form for consent. This year the consent for your children is ONLINE! This means for your child to receive the flu immunisation or for it to be declined **EVERYONE MUST** click on the link and complete the form even if you do NOT want your child to have the vaccine. You can complete the form now if you wish by clicking here

More information is available on the letter which will be sent out next week explaining what to do if you are unsure, if you need a vaccine which does NOT contain porcine gelatine or if you require the information in a different language.


