

Dear Parents and Carers, **Anti-Bullying Week**

This week started off with Odd Socks Day introducing Anti-Bullying Week and has ended with raising money for Children In Need. The children have been talking about relationships, friendships and the message for this year which was 'Reach Out.' We have discussed the difference between falling out with our friends and 'bullying'. Falling out can be when you have a disagreement, you misinterpret a comment, or there is a misunderstanding; these are often talked

about and can quickly be overcome. Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. This can happen face to face or online. We watched a video delivered by children to help demonstrate what to do if you experience bullying or if you see someone else being bullied. We also identified a number of people who we could 'reach out' to should we need to; this included friends, teachers and school staff, parents and carers and each other. Like our school vision describes, we are all unique individuals and we can aspire to be the best versions of ourselves but together we can make a difference especially when we need to 'reach out.'



Children In Need

Today we have raised money for Children In Need by either wearing something linked to Pudsey Bear or swapping our school jumper for our own home jumper. Children in Need is the official charity of the BBC. It raises money for disadvantaged children and young people across the UK. The charity's aim is to improve the lives of thousands of children by ensuring that their childhood is safe, happy and secure.



Outside Achievements




