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#### Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a wonderfully busy week and I have enjoyed visiting classes to share in their learning. I have seen some excellent art and design work in Year 5. They have been designing dragon eyes using clay linked to one of their class books called 'Dragonology.' I have been really impressed with our Reception class; every time I go into their classroom they are learning new phonemes in their phonics and showing off their knowledge through reading and writing. Year 1 have been completing their sewing of hand puppets. I was very impressed with their careful use of a needle and thread! In Year 2, I read some of their instructions for 'disgusting soup' following their work based on the book 'The Disgusting Sandwich' by Gareth Edwards. I was very pleased that they didn't make the 'disgusting soup!' You should have seen some of the ingredients!

Year 3 explored how magnetic force works by investigating magnets. I loved how you worked together and discussed what was happening! Year 4 have been developing their understanding of times tables and practicing 1-12 at speed! They have also been multiplying by 1 and 0 and playing with factors and products! Year 6 completed their Design Technology work linked to their Maya project by designing and making their own chocolate moulds and melting chocolate to create their new chocolate shape! Maybe we have a new Cadbury Chocolate designer in the making at St Matthias! Nursery were exploring their senses by making their own 'smelly' playdough by adding different spices; it smelled very Christmassy! Well done everyone, for having super learning behaviours and using the gifts God has given us to flourish in all that you do!
