




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#### **Parent Questionnaire Feedback**

Thank you to all the parents who completed our parent questionnaire this term. Here are some of the results...



81% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias makes sure its pupils are well behaved, 19% were neutral = 100%

60% had not experienced bullying, 28% agreed/strongly agreed bullying was dealt with effectively, 9% were neutral= 96%

85% agreed/strongly agreed that they were aware of what their child was learning, 4% were neutral =89%

98% agreed/strongly agreed that communication was effective, 2% were neutral = 100%

23% had no concerns and 62% agreed/strongly agreed that their concerns dealt with properly, 11% were neutral = 96%

89% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias had high expectations, 11% neutral = 100%

89% agreed/strongly agreed that their child did well at St Matthias, 6% were neutral = 95%

83% agreed/strongly agreed that the school lets me know how my child is doing, 15% were neutral =98%

85% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias helped parents to support their child's learning, 13% were neutral =98%

92% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias supported their child's wider personal development, 8% were neutral =100%

92% agreed/strongly agreed that there was a good range of subjects available, 8% were neutral = 100%

89% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias prepared their child for the future, 9% were neutral = 98%

96% agreed/strongly agreed that St Matthias is well led and managed, 4% were neutral = 100%

94% agreed/strongly agreed that they would recommend St Matthias to another parent, 6% were neutral = 100%

23% of the questionnaires represented families with pupils with SEND and 90% of those agreed/strongly agreed that the school gives their child the support they need to succeed, 10% were neutral = 100%

32% of the families completing the questionnaire shared that it was important to them that their child attends a church school.

We were overwhelmingly grateful for the positive comments and suggestions we received and will take on board many of the suggestions to ensure that we continue to improve St Matthias for the good of your children. Thank you.

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# Household Support Fund



In partnership with the **Department for Work and Pensions** (DWP) the **Household Support Fund** (HSF) grant will help households in Worcestershire who are most in need for support with energy bills, food and water bills. The scheme will run between 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023.

## The Household Support Fund

The Household Support Fund (HSF) will provide support to those most in need (including families with children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers, and people with disabilities) by providing vouchers or payments to eligible households or making direct provisions to help with food and goods.
