An article written by our Speech and Language Therapist Jasmin Jacks: <u>Speech and Language - Listening</u>

Good listening underpins all language development and helps children to interact successfully with others. There are four rules of good listening:

- 1. Listening to ALL the words
- 2. Looking at the person who is talking

Sitting still
Staying quiet

5 ways to help children listen!

Model the behaviour you want to see © Stop what you are doing if you can and look at them when they speak to you.



Praise good listening behaviour when they show it... "you were so quiet when I was talking then! That really helped you do your BEST listening".

Keep your instructions short. The less you say the more they listen! Don't just say 'listen to me!' Be <u>explicit</u> about what you want them to do e.g. "*I need you listen all the way to the* <u>end of my words</u>".

> Be careful about background noise. It makes it much harder for children to listen so turn it down or turn it off!
