Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

It was lovely to meet Charley from the Air Ambulance charity this week. As you will have read in Newsletter 17, a couple of weeks ago, our School Council Representative Fraser emailed Charley to invite her to tell us about the Air Ambulance service and why raising money is so important for them. Kayleigh introduced her to the school and Charley then told us all about the charity. They rely totally on money raised through donations to keep the charity going. Last year 16 schools across Worcestershire took part and raised enough money for one rescue mission. This year 31 schools have signed up for 'Wear it Red' day on Tuesday 14th February and we are one of those schools!



Here are some of the interesting facts she shared...

- They have 3 air ambulance helicopters and 3 critical care cars across 6 Midlands counties (Worcestershire, West Midlands, Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Shropshire and Staffordshire.)
- Helicopters can fly with a top speed of 160mph (2 miles every minute)!
- They can reach 90% of their patients in the 6 counties in around 10 minutes.
- Each air ambulance and each critical care car carries full medical equipment and medicines worth over £150,000 inside each one; it is like flying a mini hospital!
- Each air ambulance mission costs £2,950 and each critical care car mission costs £288!
- Since launching the air ambulance charity they have attended over 69,000 missions averaging 12-13 a day.
- On average they attend 4,500 missions per year.
- Top 3 mission call outs- cardiac arrest, road traffic accidents, falls and collapses
- 75% of the missions are to males and 25% are to females
- 77% of missions are to adults and 23% of missions are to children

Therefore, we are looking forward to taking part in the 'Wear it Red' day on Valentines Day to show our love for the Air Ambulance Charity and all their amazing life saving skills to help people who need them urgently. All we ask is for a small **donation of £1, or more**, to wear anything with red on it. Red socks, jumpers, T shirts, trousers etc. The item can have a small amount of red or a lot of red on it, if you don't have anything at home with red on it, then you can wear your uniform as we celebrate red every day!

Internet Safety & Children's Mental Health Week (6th February to 10th February.)

This week the teachers planned a number of activities linked to Internet Safety and Children's Mental Health Week.

Safer Internet Day 2023 was on Tuesday 7th February, the theme for this year was 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversation about life online.' During this week we invited our Community Support Officers in to school to talk about Internet Safety, to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people. The Community Support Officer also discussed safety in the community and being respectful young citizens. They are all really important messages especially as most communication these days between young people is via technology.

As part of Mental Health week and Internet Safety Week, our youngest children shared a story called 'Hanni's Magic Window' that showed that although technology can show us amazing things, sometimes we may see things that could make us feel sad, scared or worried. The children discussed how they should always tell an adult if they see something they don't like or something that makes them worried or upset; sharing this can make us feel better. They also had a visit from PC Freeman who talked about staying safe in the community and online and his role as a Police Officer. They even got to try on some police uniform!

Children's Mental Health Week theme is 'Let's Connect.' It focuses on meaningful connections as people thrive in communities and a feeling of connection is vital for our wellbeing. When we have healthy connections— to family, friends and others— this can support our mental health and our sense of wellbeing. 'The Invisible String' by Patrice Karst shares perfectly how people are connected together by love, even when those people are not together in the same place. Year One thought about and drew pictures of people or pets who they have a connection of love with and they showed a visible connection in their pictures through connecting with wool. Year 5 played a 'Let's Connect Bingo' and Year 6 have created paper chains to show how they connect with people and value their own and others' talents.


