Mothering Sunday - 19th March










Reception Class Trip to Worcester Woods.

Oliver Y4, who is looking forward to his match tomorrow at football and the 'friendly' match between parents and children afterwards! Enjoy!





Attendance

As a school, we have a legal duty to keep you informed of your child's attendance. We are now half way through this academic year, so today, every child will bring home a slip with their attendance percentage on. These slips are not intended to cause offence, they are merely there to keep you up to date with your child's progress so far this school year. We understand that in most cases we have had valid reasons for these absences.

At St Matthias we believe that good attendance and punctuality are vital for a child to progress to the best of their ability. Even in the Nursery and Reception classes, regular absence causes a rift in the child's education and can also disrupt their friendship groups.

Our expectation is for every child to have an attendance of 96% or above even in our Nursery class, where good punctuality and regular attendance get a child into good habits for their future school and work life.

Please only keep your child at home if they are genuinely ill. If a dose of Calpol or similar will keep them ticking through the day, then please send them to school. Thank you for your support in this matter.
