#### **Speech and Language - Emotions**

It can be tricky for children to understand and process their emotions. Here are five ways you can teach emotions:

5 ways to teach emotions 3

Make sure your tone and Give them the name for facial expression and what they are feeling words all match! Teach emotions one at a time. Start with the Link emotions to a cause easiest - e.g happy, for them and for others. cross, surprised and "I feel sad when..... sad. Move on to harder "You are happy because..." ones - e.g. scared, Encourage children bored, embarrassed to look at faces to **SEE** emotions

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#### Easter Bonnet Parade - Friday 31st March 9.00am

It is a bit of a tradition to hold an Easter Bonnet Parade on the last day of the Spring Term. This year we will be helping the children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to make or decorate an Easter Bonnet in school on Wednesday 29th and Thursday 30th March so they can wear and parade them for all parents and KS2 children to see on Friday 31st. We are providing lots of the items needed to make their bonnet, but if you would like to provide the actual bonnet and any decorations for them to decorate it please send them



in to school in a named bag on Wednesday 29th March ready for decorating. If any KS2 children would like to make a bonnet at home they are more than welcome. Any KS2 child who brings an Easter bonnet into school can walk with the parade too!

Parents are welcome to stay in the playground on Friday 31st March, to clap and cheer the children as they parade in their Easter bonnets. We aim to parade through the Nursery and KS1 playground to the KS2 playground and then back again and in through the Nursery doors. KS2 will line the KS2 playground ready to clap and parents can stand in the Nursery and KS1 playground. It is always a lovely occasion and the children are always proud of their decorated hats.

#### 'Teaching Trees' Visitor

This week, our Year One class had a special visitor called Tim from 'Teaching Trees.' They all went to our school field and started the visit with a tree warm up! The children were challenged to hunt for special posters which shared messages about why trees are important. After learning why trees are important, they made a tree using their bodies! A group of children made the 'heartwood' which is in the centre of the trunk and it is very strong!



Surrounding this, children linked to show the 'sapwood' which helps with the transport of water and minerals to the crown of the tree. A third group of children surrounded the sapwood and became the roots - sucking up all the water and goodness from the ground! The final layer of our human tree were the leaves, collecting sunlight and dancing around! Mrs Howden and Mrs O'Connor were the mushrooms because fungi help the tree to conduct water and minerals to the tree roots! The children completed lots of activities including a bug hunt and had a wonderful time!
