Welcome back after the February half term, we hope you had a lovely break! We have had an incredibly busy week which has involved many different events and outings.


Parents' Evening

Thank you to everyone who attended Parents' Evening this week, we hope you enjoyed looking at your childrens' books and hearing about their progress in class. Out of 190 children in our school, we had 163 booked parent consultations over the last two evenings and 156 of you attended and met with your children's class teacher which was just lovely to see. Our staff work incredibly hard to write the interim reports and they love sharing the successes your children have achieved so they are pleased when they can share this with you in person. I know lots of children have also appreciated their parents looking at books and congratulating them on their progress. If you were unable to make the parent consultations we will be sending home the written interim report to you over the next week.

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Reading for Pleasure at St Matthias World Book Day 2023



We aim to inspire our children to develop a love for reading. Developing a habit of reading for pleasure is crucial and we do this in school in a variety of ways:

Being Read to Regularly: Each class has a 'special box' with high-quality books inside it. Every day, the class teacher will read one of these books to the children in Class Novel time. We also use texts recommended by the Centre for Literacy in Primary Education in our English lessons, so our children experience a wide range of rich language and the best quality books.










Having a choice in what to read: Our reading areas in each classroom are very well stocked. Each reading area also has 'interest boxes' so children can choose from a range of genres, not just fiction: from newspapers and magazines to non-fiction books and poetry.







Having books at home: Children take a book home every week from our bookshelves (linked to their reading ability). We also run a 'Book Swap Library', which is located in the reception area, where children can borrow a book and then swap it for another when they've finished it...so your child should never be short of a new book to enjoy! Just drop in and take a book! We promote reading every week in our celebration assembly. Children are selected each week if they have read at home or gained 100% in their comprehension quiz and they receive a new book as a prize.





Finding time to read: Research shows that reading for pleasure is a vital indicator of a child's success and **this is where you can help!** Share stories with your children by reading to them and also making time to hear them read to you. It is important to make reading part of their daily routine and make reading fun!

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World Book Day 2023

Our World Book Day event started on Thursday with a whole school assembly delivered by our English Lead, Mrs Maidens, who was dressed as the word 'incognito.' We talked about World Book Day, its origins and where we like to read and the types of books we like to read! We also shared some of the 'Extreme Reading' photographs which have been sent to the teachers during the half term break and this week! (No child was hurt in the process of these reads!)



Assembly was followed by a vocabulary parade on the top playground! It is hard to believe that we had over 200 people dressed up as so many different words! Quite incredible! I know each class celebrated the event in their own way in the classrooms, discussing vocabulary, definitions, synonyms and writing about their words. Mrs Maidens organised for each child to receive a World Book Day book, free of charge donated by the 'Malvern Book Cooperative' Shop; she also gave every child a £1 World Book Day token. On Friday the classes were entertained online by Authors - Yasmeen Ismail and Frank Cottrell-Boyce. As part of our World Book Day event there was a 'Big Book Giveaway' where children could choose any book they want to take home. This may also continue into next week.

Our World Book Day event was really successful so thank you to all the parents who supported and became very creative at home with their children to help in the dressing up decisions and also the extreme reading event. We received 38 extreme reading photographs which was wonderful! We took many photographs of the event and here is a very small snapshot!
































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Reading Café World Book Day Event

Frankenstein from the film 'The Monster of Doctor Frankenstein, some children imagined they were the monster, Dr Frankenstein or other characters such as Igor. They played warm up games and they got to perform their creations with sound effects and special lighting techniques! They had a wonderful time!





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Packed Lunch - REMINDERS

As a healthy school, part of our brief is to promote and monitor healthier food at lunch and break times. We actively encourage children to bring a healthy lunch to school. (for example a sandwich, wrap or similar with crisps or similar, a piece of fruit and a cake). **Children should not have chocolate or sweets at school**. Children can bring a cake, Penguin or Kit Kat, but NOT a chocolate bar such as Dairy milk, Mars bar etc.

We ask that children do not bring in peanuts or have peanut butter in sandwiches, as some children do have serious allergies to them. Thank you.

We encourage the children to drink regularly throughout the day. A bottle of water or weak squash should be brought in every day. No fizzy or energy drinks are permitted.

Our involvement in the National **Free Fruit Scheme** means that all children in Nursery, Reception, Yrs 1 & 2 are given a piece of fruit every day. We encourage Key Stage 2 children (ie. Yrs 3, 4, 5 & 6) to bring in their own fruit or a piece of cheese to eat at break-time.

Children's Asthma Nurse At Home Service for 6-16 year olds in Worcestershire (pilot scheme)



Would you like your child to receive a review of their asthma at home?

Is your child aged between 6 and 16 years old and using regular inhalers for their asthma but having difficulty keeping their asthma under control?

If so, then we would like to arrange a visit to see you and your child at home. We will spend up to an hour

talking about the child's asthma and how to manage it to gain better control. We can also talk to your GP about making changes to medication to support





How do I find out more?

Please contact our asthma nurses, Mandy and Katie, to find out more about the service and see if your child is eligible. Young people are welcome to refer themselves too. PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS A PILOT SCHEME AND TIME LIMITED.
