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Half term holiday food vouchers

If you are eligible for Free School Meals (not universal free school meals) we are able to provide children with their half term holiday food vouchers. These will come to families via the email which you have provided us with, from Edenred. The vouchers will arrive by **Wednesday 24th May**. If you do not received them please contact us before Friday 26th May however, check your junk mail first as sometimes they land in that email box!

If you feel that you might be entitled to Free School Meals, because you are on a low income and claim benefits and have not registered before then please see the information below.

Who can get Free School Meals?

If your child attends a state school, and you get one or more of the following you can get free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act, 1999
- Child Tax Credit, and your annual income is less than £16,190
- Guaranteed Pension Credit
- Income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on

Universal Credit, and your annual household income is £7,400 per annum (£616 per month) or less after tax, and not including any benefits.



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Police information - Operation Sceptre 15th -21st May 23

Our Local Policing team have been sharing leaflets regarding 'knife crime' and the opportunity for people to hand in dangerous weapons as part of Operation Sceptre. Knife crime is on the increase and the only way we can stop knife crime is by handing in weapons or reporting people who have weapons. We support this operation as it keeps our communities and families safe, so please share this information. All year round knives can be surrendered, no questions asked, at participating police stations. #TACKLINGVIOLENCETOGETHER

Anyone who is concerned a young person is involved in or on the periphery of becoming involved in knife crime and carrying a knife can report this anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. More information for young people about the stark consequences of knife crime can be found at www.fearless.org where concerns can also be reported anonymously.



The Offensive Weapons Act 2019

- It is now illegal to possess certain weapons in private places, including your home. This includes items such as knuckledusters, flick knives and telescopic truncheons.
- There will also be changes to the process of buying knives online with enhanced age verification checks at point of sale and collection/delivery.
- Please store and dispose of knives safely to reduce the risk of them being used as weapons.
- Help prevent knife crime by reporting any concerns, including about how they are sold, to the Police or anonymously to Crimestoppers.

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Speech and Language – Starting Conversations


This is one for older children.
