With the summer holidays looming lots of children may be visiting the seaside or walking near rivers, lakes or streams and therefore we invited speakers from The Splash to come and deliver a very important assembly linked to drowning prevention week. The children listened to the 'Water Safety Code'; they were tested with true and false facts during the worship and explored what to do should they or anyone else got into trouble in the water. Did you know...

...as we celebrated Drowning Prevention Week last year, it was lovely to hear lots of children recall the learning and remember some of the rules around flag colours for safety on the beach and what to do in the event of an emergency! Resources and activity sheets were emailed to parents on 22nd June following the assembly so learning can be shared at home and reminders given by parents.

What would his voice sound like?
