#### **Governor Review**

This has been a week full of successes. This week, four of our governors visited school to complete a Governor Review of English along with our School Improvement Partner. The morning was very successful and the children were very much engaged with their learning as usual. I am always so proud when I am showing any visitors around our school as the children are so inviting and loving their learning. The governors saw evidence of consistent practice across the school in the delivery of phonics and this also led into the teaching of spelling further up the school. There was clear evidence of impact of the teaching of Phonics as the children applied their learning to their reading and writing. The governors commented on the high levels of engagement and responses from all learners in all classes whether they were working as a whole class, in small groups or individually. We were very proud of the developments in writing and how the children are embracing editing their work with purple pens, even in the younger classes and this showed a consistent approach across the school. There were many more positives and I would like to say a huge "thank you" to Mrs Maidens our English Lead for organising the morning for our Governor Review. I would also like to thank all staff and children for welcoming our visitors into the classes to share in our learning.

#### Parents' Evening

Thank you to everyone to managed to attend our two Parents' Evenings this week, 84% of children had a face to face or telephone parent consultation. It was lovely to see and hear the buzz of teachers and parents discussing the successes of the children. This was a great opportunity for you to talk to the teachers, find out about how your child is doing in school and see their books. Our next formal Parents' Evening will be in the Spring Term. However, please don't think this is the only opportunity to speak to the teachers. If you have a worry or concern or just need to inform them of something, then please don't hesitate to contact them. There are a few ways to contact your child's class teacher: via a ClassDojo message, making an appointment via the office, requesting a telephone appointment or simply catching them after school when they are on the playground. If you were unable to make your appointment you will receive a short written summary of the discussion you would have had with the class teacher.








#### **Outside Achievements**
