
## **Christmas Fayre Fundraising**

## **Important Building Work at St Matthias Commencing in January 2024**

I would like to inform you all of an extension project that is commencing in January 2024.

The extension will be added onto the back of our Nursery and Year One area. This means that there may be some disruption to the running of the school day, the entrance where Nursery parents arrive and depart and some areas of school will be closed to children and all adults.



The Nursery gate will also be closed off to parents so Nursery parents must use the bottom KS1 gate to access to and from Nursery, as seen in this picture.

The first two weeks will have the most disruption as they remove the soil from the site of the build and transport it to the site of removal. A risk assessment has been completed, all work will stop across the playground when the children have their break times.





The Nursery and Reception area will be reduced in space, however they will have special barriers protecting them and keeping them safe in the area allocated for play.

Although, this will be disruptive for a short period of time, particularly for our Year One, Reception and Nursery classes, it is a necessary build and the younger children will enjoy watching the machinery at work at a safe distance.

We thank you for your support and vigilance during this period of work.

## Hello.

Merry Christmas! Please read the information carefully for information on the Christmas HAF programme.

#### Who can participate in HAF?

HAF is a government funded programme for children and young people aged 5-16 in receipt of benefits related Free School Meals.

## Can my non-FSM child participate?

In line with Department for Education guidelines, the HAF Programme is primarily for children in receipt of benefits related Free School Meals.

Some providers have a limited number of places available for non-FSM children who would otherwise be considered vulnerable however these places are not guaranteed and must be requested with providers to review and accept. Where activity clubs are fully booked by FSM eligible children, there will not be any additional spaces for non-FSM eligible participants.

#### 'My child is too young for activities'

If your child is younger than 5, we can not guarantee them places.

The programme is designed for children and young people aged 5-16. Some providers let younger children take part, however this is not the norm.

## 'My pending requests have not been accepted'

As is stated on the website, non-FSM children are not guaranteed places. If you would like to discuss your pending request, you will need to contact the club directly.

#### 'Where is my HAF code?'

For booking activities outside the HAF website, you will most likely be asked for a code. This can be found under the child's name in the 'My Children' section.
