### Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

The children have been enjoying their learning again this week and both myself and Mr Thompson were very impressed as we took an impromptu walk through every classroom. We are always proud to visit classes and observe how the children are being challenged and how they respond to questions and challenges with thought and prior learning. Activating our brain and recalling previous learning to problem solve is a super skill to have, along with reflection and building new knowledge.

We were impressed with the children responding to marking and editing their work using their purple pens. Being able to edit and improve work, ready for publishing, enables the children to have high expectations of themselves to achieve their very best.

Mrs Maidens has completed a book look this term and has noted progress, improved presentation and increased implementation of writing skills which are also seen in other areas of the curriculum. Mrs West has also completed a Maths book look, she was also impressed with the progress seen and how children are applying mathematical skills they have learned to problem solving and reasoning. Teachers have high expectations of your children and always strive to get the best from them. You will be able to see your child's books during Parents' Evening which is being held after half term.

The Parents' consultations will be face to face and will be held in the school hall. This will give you an opportunity to speak to the class teacher, find out how your child is getting along and ask any questions you might have. If you have any worries or concerns in the mean time, it is important that you do not leave them until Parents' Evening. You can raise any worries you have or questions via ClassDojo or ask for a telephone appointment if you wish.

We will send out a booking text for Parents' Evening nearer the time so that you can book in with the class teacher.

If any parent is unable to make either of those dates, we will send home a short update report and if you need to discuss any part of it you may make a separate appointment with the class teacher after the event.

On the 8th January the Government launched a new national campaign highlighting the importance of school attendance.

### ' Moments Matter, Attendance Counts.'

St Matthias has joined that campaign as we know that good school attendance not only gives your child the best education for their future, but it develops social skills, builds positive peer relationships, routine, life skills and enjoyment in a child's life building long lasting memories. Primary school education builds the foundations for further education and



knowledge into career paths. We are shaping lives and creating our next generation of doctors, nurses, mechanics, educators, emergency service workers and so much more. We want to work with you to provide the best for your child and in order for success to happen they need to be in school to receive their education and positive attitudes to learning.

We also recognise that children can be poorly; life throws us challenges and it isn't always easy when a child is upset or refusing. We are here to listen, support and work with you to increase attendance. You are not alone and you will not be the only parent to have struggled at some point and talking to us is the first step!

### **Education Engagement Officer**

Not only have we requested to join an Attendance Hub through the DfE, we have a new Education Engagement Officer (EEO) working with us. They will look at our data, our Persistently Absent children and work with us to raise attendance for children who may be missing school. Persistently Absent children are children who have an attendance percentage of lower that 90%. Children below 50% attendance are now known as 'severely absent.'

We aim for your child to have an attendance of 96% or above which means less than 7 days absent per year.

### What we will do as a school to support the campaign and raise attendance.

- Welcome your child into school every day and provide them with a high quality education
- Give them toast and fruit, as snacks
- Praise improved attendance and good attendance through incentives in school and certificates.
- Contact you for a reason on the first day of your child's absence, if you have not contacted us first
- Send regular updates to inform you of your child's attendance and/or lates
- We may ask you to provide medical evidence, appointment evidence or medication evidence
- Ask you to make medical appointments outside of school hours
- Make home visits, send emails or make telephone calls
- Listen to any concerns or support that is requested
- For persistently absent pupils create a plan to enable your child to successful attendance school
- Work with the Dfe and share our attendance data
- Continue to signpost families to external support and information websites for advice
- Promote Family Learning programmes
- We do not authorise holidays in term time and have a duty to report holidays booked through the attendance portal.

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### WHIZZ KIDS REMINDER

Our Whizz Kids wraparound care is becoming more and more popular and numbers are rising, which we are very please about. However, this makes it very difficult for last minute bookings. Therefore, please can I remind you that it is expected and essential for our staffing ratios, that Whizz Kids places are pre booked. This is important on every day of the week but particularly on Fridays as Mrs James is not here on a Friday and is responsible for organising the staffing. It is sometimes difficult for staff to cover longer Whizz Kids hours at short notice. Please could I ask that you be mindful of this to avoid any disappointment if we have to say no to a last minute booking. Thank you for your consideration. Booking forms are available on request by email or on paper in the main office.

### Number Day 2024
