Learning Walks

Mr Thompson and I have been visiting classes this week and completing some learning walks. We are always impressed with the consistency of approach through the school as the teachers deliver their Maths and English lessons. Working walls build up the learning through the week and are an excellent reference to the children as a support for learning. We saw lots of evidence of editing of writing and using their writing skills across the curriculum. Even our youngest children learn to edit as they learn to improve their number and letter formation or orientation, to correct key vocabulary and spellings as they progress through the school. We are always very proud of what we observe in the classroom and admire the high expectations our staff have of learning so we get the best from your children.

This week we celebrated story telling week. The children at St Matthias enjoy listening to stories and every day each class finishes with a class novel.



New Attendance Profiles — February 2024

Dear Parents and Carers,

As a school, we have a legal duty to keep you informed of your child's attendance. We are now approaching the end of the 3rd half term of this school year, so at the end of this half term, every child in school will bring home our newly designed Attendance Profile. The Attendance Profile will show your child's attendance percentage, the number of school learning days they have missed,



how many late arrivals they have had and how many minutes of lessons they missed and whether your child's attendance is improving or slipping downwards. It will also give you key information about attendance in general. We will send these out at the end of each half term ie. Six times per year.

These profiles are not intended to cause offence; they are merely our new way to keep you up to date with your child's progress throughout the year. We do understand that in most cases we have had valid reasons for absences.

In addition to the Attendance Profiles we will continue to monitor every child's Monthly attendance and issue certificates to those who have 96% or above.

Don't forget...

at the end of every month all children with 100% have their names put into a hat and <u>one</u> lucky child wins a voucher. and ...

at the end of every full term (ie. 3 times a year) all children with 100% have their names put into a hat and <u>one</u> lucky child wins a voucher.

and ...

at the end of every full year all children with 100% are rewarded with a voucher.

111 pupils had 100% Attendance for January 2024 plus a further 8 pupils had between 96% and 99.9%. So 119 our of 177 pupils have attained the DFE target. Well done to you all!
