Dear Parents, Carers and Children,


We have come to the end of a very short but very busy half term. Next week is February half term and we return on Monday 19th February at 8.40am. Please remember that our Parents Evenings' will be held in the first week back and your appointments will have been emailed to you following the booking that you made. We will look forward to sharing your childrens successes with you and our planned next steps.

This week has seen us celebrate Children's Mental Health Week, Internet Safety Day and also 'Wear it Red' Day for our chosen charity the Air Ambulance. The children have taken part in many activities and focused on keeping safe online and in our community, but also remembering to look after themselves and being kind to ourselves.



Internet Safety Day 2024

Safer Internet Day 2024 was on Tuesday 6th February, the theme for this year is 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, Managing influence and Navigating change online.' During this week we invited our Community Support Officer in to school to talk about Internet Safety, to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people. The Community Support Officer also discussed safety in the community and being respectful young citizens. They are all really important messages especially as most communication these days between young people is via technology.







With our older children PC Freeman talked about how to stay safe online, how to block and report concerns and age limits on games and reasons for this. Lots of children socialise through gaming and these can provoke both positive and negative experiences for children. We encourage all parents to monitor the games children are accessing, the age ratings for the games and ensure that you know who they are talking to online. We also encourage a switch off time to ensure that children do not access gaming into the late evening. Ensuring good sleep patterns is important for mental health and wellbeing.






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Children's Mental Health Week.

The theme for this year is 'My Voice Matters.' It is about empowering children and young people and giving them the tools they need to express themselves. The younger years shared a book called 'Speak Up, you can make a difference.' by Nathan Bryan. This fits beautifully with our school vision too where we celebrate how we can make a difference to our ever changing world. It is about a little boy called Rocket who used his voice to raise awareness about something he felt passionate about. His voice was heard and the library was saved by people listening and donating money.



We also enjoyed our 'Let's Connect' sessions with our parents in Early Years, Year one and Year two. We loved watching the parents get as messy as the children and enjoying time together. I know the children loved having their families involved in their learning. Early Years combined their 'Let's Connect' session with their celebration of the Luna New Year. Year one linked their 'Let's Connect' session to their art project, from a famous quote by the artist Paul Klee as he described a line as 'a dot that went for a walk.' The Year 1 children and their parents created their own drawings and took their dot for a walk! Year 2 had fun with their parents by playing lots of games in their 'Let's Connect' session.

This website holds a wealth of parenting advice from child mental health experts. It gives you practical tips to support children's wellbeing and behaviour.

There are 51 topics such as...

My child doesn't want to go to school
My child keeps getting angry and lashing out
My child is anxious
Playing with my child
Co-parenting after a separation or divorce
Understanding shyness in children
My child has trouble going to sleep



Each topic has a very short video clip and suggestions for ways that parents can support their children. These are really easy self help suggestions which can be done in the home.

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'Wear it Red Day'

Thank you to everyone who supported our charity event this term by wearing as much red as possible and bringing in £1. The Air Ambulance is such an important charity as it is run entirely on funds raised by donations and events like we have held today. All the Malvern schools were invited by the Air Ambulance charity to raise money this week by showing their love for the Air Ambulance service and wearing as much red as possible. Last year 31 schools signed up, I think this year will be similar!

This is a reminder of what we know about the Air Ambulance service...

- They have 3 air ambulance helicopters and 3 critical care cars across 6 Midlands counties (Worcestershire, West Midlands, Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Shropshire and Staffordshire.)
- ♦ Helicopters can fly with a top speed of 160mph (2 miles every minute)!
- ♦ They can reach 90% of their patients in the 6 counties in around 10 minutes.
- Each air ambulance and each critical care car carries full medical equipment and medicines worth over £150,000 inside each one; it is like flying a mini hospital!
- Each air ambulance mission costs £2,950 and each critical care car mission costs £288!
- Since launching the air ambulance charity they have attended over 69,000 missions averaging 12-13 a day.
- On average they attend 4,500 missions per year.
- ♦ Top 3 mission call outs— cardiac arrest, road traffic accidents, falls and collapses
- 75% of the missions are to males and 25% are to females
- 77% of missions are to adults and 23% of missions are to children.






Author Visit - Whole school (Tuesday 5th March)

Attendance Profiles — February 2024

Dear Parents and Carers,

As a school, we have a legal duty to keep you informed of your child's attendance. We have now reached the end of the 3rd half term of this school year, every child in school will bring home our newly designed Attendance Profile on 19th February or during the week they return to school. The Attendance Profile will show your child's attendance percentage, the number of school learning days they have missed, how many late arrivals they have had and how many minutes of lessons they missed and whether your child's attendance



is improving or slipping downwards. It will also give you key information about attendance in general. We will send these out at the end of each half term ie. Six times per year.

These profiles are not intended to cause offence; they are merely our new way to keep you up to date with your child's progress throughout the year. We do understand that in most cases we have had valid reasons for absences.

In addition to the Attendance Profiles we will continue to monitor every child's Monthly attendance and issue certificates to those who have 96% or above.

Don't forget...

at the end of every month all children with 100% have their names put into a hat and one lucky child wins a voucher.

at the end of every full term (ie. 3 times a year) all children with 100% have their names put into a hat and <u>one</u> lucky child wins a youcher.

and ..

at the end of every full year <u>all children with 100%</u> are rewarded with a voucher.

111 pupils had 100% Attendance for January 2024 plus a further 8 pupils had between 96% and 99.9%. So 119 our of 177 pupils have attained the DFE target. Well done to you all!

Every Friday we hold a 'Celebration Worship' to give out awards to our children to celebrate their achievements.




