#### **ELS Phonics visit.**

This week we welcomed an Early Reading Expert to our school to discuss and review our Essential Letters and Sounds Early Reading and Phonics offer. The Early Reading Expert is from one of the nationwide English Hubs which is funded by the Department for Education and supports schools to deliver high quality teaching of early language, love of reading and phonics. She has been working with our school for the past two years and has commented on the incredible implementation of our ELS



scheme which has now been in place for those two years. Some of you will remember when we made the change and it has been an extremely positive one. She observed phonics and reading lessons and closing the gap interventions. She discussed data and progress from the previous visits she has made. I want to say a huge thank you to the children for welcoming her into the school and also the staff involved in delivering the lessons and discussing our progress. She always comments on her welcome, the progress made and our wonderful children and staff.

We are also sharing good practice with other schools across our Trust as the impact of the Phonics Scheme on Early Reading and Writing is of a high standard.

#### **New Ramp**

Thank you for your cooperation and patience while the ramp was created this week. The children adapted well and after a few minor hiccups in the finishing of the ramp it was completed ahead of schedule!

#### Years 5 & 6 Author Trip


