

#### Lent Experience at St Matthias Church.

Thank you to all the volunteers who gave up their time this week to deliver the 'Lent Experience' to each class. The children travelled around the church in groups to 6 activity stations where they learned about the period of lent. Lent starts on Ash Wednesday and finishes with a celebration on Easter Sunday.

#### Station 1 – Lengthening

The children looked at different items that you may need to take on a journey and guessed what kind of holiday you may go on to need flippers, walking boots, sun cream or a camping mat. We were told that going on holiday could lengthen or stretch your mind as it broadens your experiences, it was compared to spring-time when days start to get longer.

We were reminded that Lent is the time before Easter where we learn more about Jesus

#### Station 2 – Letting Go

The children had to imagine that we travelled back a thousand years ago at a time when days began to get longer (spring). We learnt the Saxon word 'lengthen' which means length. Today we call this time, 'Lent'.

Long ago, at this time, people couldn't eat meat, eggs or drink milk so they had to use up the ingredients because they did not have electricity and a fridge to store them in so people made pancakes.

During Lent, we often try to give things up. Today we learnt that some Christians try to give up feelings because they can hurt us or the people around us such as being impatient, sad, angry or frustration. We heard how emotions can hurt and it is important to let them go and 'give them to God'.

#### Station 3 – Life Choice

The children felt different fabrics and thought of some adjectives to describe the texture. When the children felt the sack cloth, they described it as 'itchy', 'rough' and 'itchy'. They learnt that in Bible times, if people were sad and wanted forgiveness they would wear sack cloth so they felt close to God.

At this time, they made the mark of a cross on their forehead using ash from burnt palm crosses as a sign that they were trying to be close to God.

#### Station 4 – Listening

At this station, the children talked about a passport and how it proves who you are. For Christians, Jesus' baptism was the beginning of his journey. The voice of God was heard as Jesus rose from the water saying, " this is my beloved Son with whom I am pleased". A dove came down and flew to Jesus.

Baptism is a sign that you belong to God's family.

Children were invited to make an identity card to show something special about them.

#### **Station 5 - Following**

The children were asked to try and tempt Eileen to give us her bag – she was offered chocolate, sweets and money but she resisted. She didn't accept nice things.

They were told how this is very similar to when Jesus was tempted in the desert to show how special he was but he resisted.

We then watched an experiment to show temptation moving away as we placed a finger inside soapy water – the pepper moved away.

#### Station 6 – Keep Going

The children had a little party and celebrated Jesus' resurrection.

They shared a hot cross bun and recognised the symbol of the cross on top. They learnt how thousands of years ago, spices were very expensive. Jesus resurrection was a very special celebration so spices were used to warm you and make the bun hot, hence the name 'hot cross bun'.

We have already started to celebrate our outside achievements this week. They were shared in our Worship this morning and we hope to inspire lots of you to share your outside achievements with us in school!
