Well Dressing

Phonics Workshop for Year One Parents Monday 29th April 2.45pm

Year One parents are invited to a Phonics Workshop ahead of the Phonics Screening Test for Year 1 children which happens in June. This is an important meeting during which we will share what happens during the test, and show you how you can help and support your child to do their very best on the day. Learning phonics is essential as it helps your child to read and write. Without phonics knowledge your child will struggle to decode words. During the teaching of phonics not only will your child learn new sounds and graphemes but they will also learn to blend, decode and segment words for reading which also supports writing development; so please come along.

Trust Art Day

This week, four of our Year 6 children were selected to join 6 of our other Trust and affiliated Schools for an Art Day held at St John's Middle School. The schools who attended were St John's Middle, Catshill First and Middle school, Witton

Middle, Aston Fields Middle, Parkside Middle and of course us! Unfortunately St John's Primary School were unable to make it on this occasion. The children were put into groups for the day and each group were involved in four workshops linked to 'Earth Day' which is an annual event on 22nd April. The global event aims to raise awareness about environmental conservation and the importance of protecting our environment. The skills involved in the workshops were linked to the





four elements Wind Fire, Earth and Water. Their activities included: illustration, printing, clay work and creating art with nature in the outdoor environment.

Collecting children from school

Only Year 6 are permitted to walk home from school at 3.15pm, with a permission letter from a parent. A Senior member of staff will have a conversation about safety and route home. If they are in an after school club until 4pm, an adult must collect their child.

Sometimes an older sibling may collect a younger sibling. We are unable to hand your child over to a sibling unless they are with their parent/carer or over the age of 16. We have had experience in the past where children have been unsafe and therefore to ensure the safety of your children we are politely asking you to respect this rule.

Mobile phones

Primary School children do not need to bring a mobile phone to school unless they are permitted to walk home alone in Year 6. Year 6 children MUST hand their mobile phone to their class teacher when they arrive; the phone must be turned off. The phone will be kept safely by the teacher until the end of the day. Should any other child, not in Year 6, need to bring a mobile phone into school they must hand this into the office for safe keeping and collect it at the end of the day. No mobile phone or any other home electronic device should be left in bags or lockers during the day.

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Curriculum Excitement.

A few weeks ago Nursery discovered a giant egg in their classroom. Over the past few weeks, they have been guessing what might be growing inside it. They came up with some super ideas – a chick, a spider, a dinosaur and many more! The children have been looking after the egg, treating it with care and last week it started to hatch! On Friday they arrived at school to discover that 'Steggy' the baby Stegosaurus cracked his way out! The children were very gentle and took turns to stroke him, they gave him a bowl and some leaves so he had food. They also looked at different fossils and made salt dough dinosaur fossils. Next week they are learning about pets and how to look after other animals.





Our Reception Class have been learning how to look after their teeth and taking on the role of 'Dentists.' This helped them when our School Nurses came in to visit and complete their teeth checks as part of the NHS dental health checks for children. Well done for being brave with the school nursing team and remember to brush your teeth twice a day!









Our Year One class have been looking at animal sculptures created by Johnson Zuze who used wire to create the body of the animal and filled it full of objects he found at landfill sites. His motto is 'waste no waste' and is sharing the important message of looking after our environment by turning waste into something else. The Year 1 children created animal sculptures using pipe-cleaners. It was a challenge; they had to practise skills of bending and twisting to form the desired shapes. Perseverance was essential; if they made a mistake or were unhappy with their design they could 'rewind' by undoing it and trying again.









Year Three and Four have been working with an outside drama company called Strange Futures. The company create animations and the Year 3/4 children have contributed to the script and this week were invited to add voice overs and sounds to their performance. They were recorded individually and in groups. We can't wait to see how our input adds to their performance. The animation they are producing is called "On The Bare Hill" and was inspired by the style of the text in "Under Milkwood".


