Reading

Read with your family every day for 30 minutes.

Read your keyring words and if you have access to the internet then head to <u>www.phonicsplay.co.uk</u> to play our tricky word trucks – phase 2 and 3. If your child can read them then record a video of them reading them and post it on Tapestry! I will then send you the next phase. Phase 4 is also on the Phonics Play website ⁽²⁾

Please continue to use the Oak National Academy site to access daily English, Maths and Foundation subject lessons. You can find the lessons here: <u>https://www.thenational.academy/</u> To access the lessons, click on 'Online Classroom' > 'Schedule' > 'Reception' and select the day. If you feel that your child is not



engaging with this then you can head to whiterose maths or classroom secrets for activities. You can also message Mr Salmon on Tapestry and he will send you activities for your child.

Perhaps you could write a story or an information book about a nocturnal animal? It could be called The Bothersome Bat or The Old Wise Owl...I'm sure you will have much better ideas ⁽²⁾

Time

Over the next few weeks we will be learning all about time and using time related vocabulary. We would like the children to be able to understand morning, afternoon, night, earlier and later. If they have mastered this then have a go at looking at a clock and reading o'clock. A really good activity is to take a photo or draw a picture to stick around your clock at home. You could draw a bed for 7pm or 8pm...or whenever your child goes to bed, take a photo of lunch for 12pm etc.

Nocturnal animals

We will be focussing on the story Night Monkey, Day Monkey. If you haven't got this Julia Donaldson book then here is a good link to watch it on YouTube.
