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Attendance Matters

We have sent you a text informing you of your child's attendance percentage since returning to school in September. The government's national expectation for children's attendance is 96%.

There are 365 days in a calendar year. 175 of them are not in school – that's plenty of time for shopping, days out, holidays, appointments and visiting family and friends.

Good attendance means being in school over 96% of the time. In a school year, that means being in school on over 182 out of 190 school days.

What does my child's attendance percentage mean?



Well done to all of the children who have achieved 100% attendance* since returning to school in September. Every child who has 100% attendance for the month will have their name entered into a prize draw to win a £10 Argos voucher! The lucky winner will be drawn monthly in Friday's celebration assembly and their parents will be notified by text message.

Attendance figures for the whole school in September:

Nursery	81.7%	Year 3	95.6%
Reception	97.8%	Year 4	92.7%
Year 1	96.5%	Year 5	94.4%
Year 2	95.9%	Year 6	95.8%

Reception and Year 1 are leading the way with their attendance in September! Both classes are above the target of 96% attendance. Well done and keep it up.

We hope that more classes beat the target in October.

^{*}Please note that at the moment, absence due to self-isolation whilst a child is waiting for results of a PCR test are not included in their attendance figure, so it is still possible to have 100% attendance even with time off self-isolating.


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Stranger Futures
