We have been really lucky this half term to have so many opportunities to enrich the curriculum outside of school and we have been very proud of each child for being respectful, demonstrating our school values and vision in such a positive way as they aspire, believe and achieve flourishing in everything they do no matter how challenging it is.

Year 1 Geography Walk

On Thursday afternoon, Year 1 went for a lovely local walk in the autumn sunshine as part of their learning in geography. Children looked carefully for significant features of our local area - the children were extremely observant and identified many along our route. Children spotted: the Malvern Hills, a fire hydrant, a post office, two churches, a bakery, Domino's Pizza, a post box, a special rock in the churchyard, our school field, our playground and we were also lucky enough to see a train travel across the bridge! To let traffic and pedestrians know which direction we were travelling, children used hand signals as indicators, correctly identifying left or right! When we returned to school, children marked the route on their own map and drew features that they remembered. Class 1 represented our school brilliantly, behaving beautifully.









Year 5 trip to the Literature Festival in Cheltenham

Year 5 had a wonderful day at the Literature festival. They met Vashti Hardy, an author, who talked about how she didn't think that she could ever write a story but once she believed in herself and was encouraged she found she could write and has now written a wealth of novels for children to read! Mr Thompson has ordered one of her books to share in Year 5. Following this the Year 5 children completed a workshop focusing on retelling their journey to the festival using illustrations.



Year 4 PE demonstration

I felt very privileged to have been invited to watch some PE gymnastics demonstrations from Year 4 based on stories being told through gymnastic movements. After the demonstrations each group shared their story and described what each movement represented. It was lovely to see so much choreography designed by the children themselves and the teamwork and collaboration from each child! Very impressive!



Author Visit

This week Years 4-6 joined author Joseph Coelho, an award winning poet, on Wednesday 13th October for an online event. He shared his life story with them and how he became a poet. He shared his poetry and how his poems evolved and the inspiration for them. The children made links with their own learning from the classroom, recognising similes and onomatopoeia. He shared his vast range of poetry which included one word poems and

alphabet poems and described how he decided on the themes and content for each one. Following this he inspired the children to write their own poetry following the event! We were also extremely lucky as we received 50 free copies of Happy Here which is a wonderful book representing diversity, equity and inclusion. It is important for all children, regardless of colour or background, to be able to see themselves represented in texts and be able to make sense of the world around them and this book is a fantastic example of this.

Strange Futures Year 6 Workshop

Year 6 visited Malvern Cube yesterday. They were involved in a different workshop from Year 5 last week as they created animations with tea leaves! They had a wonderful time learning how to create their own animations and drawing illustrations for their stories then bringing them to life with tea leaves!





Year 5 & 6 Cross Country event

Today our Year 5 & Year 6 took to Peachfield Common in Malvern for a cross country event! They set off looking rather worried, however came back with smiling faces and proud of their achievements!

St Richards Hospice Elephant Fundraising Event

The thirty beautiful large elephants were auctioned last night they were sold for between £5200 and £36,000. The charity auction raised a fantastic £368,800 for St Richards Hospice. The baby elephants will all return from the trail to their respective schools. Arlo our baby elephant will be returning St Matthias on Monday. Covid information – book a PCR test – symptoms

Symptoms in children may be any of these listed; high temperature, loss of appetite, ex-

treme tiredness, runny nose, sneezing, cough, sore throat, diarrhoea, vomiting, headache, joint or muscle pains, and generally feeling unwell. Many children have no symptoms. If your child has symptoms, please do not rely on the Lateral Flow Tests which can be done at home in 30 minutes. Please take your child for a PCR test and county hall or order a postal PCR test if you don't drive.

St Matthias Book Swap Library


