Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Many parents have been asking about raising money for "Children in Need" this year. However, the children have decided that there is a more important cause to raise money for at the moment. In school recently we have been sharing a book called 'Joe has Leukaemia' with all of the children. This is because one of our pupils, Freya, has recently been diagnosed with Leukaemia. Leukaemia is a type of blood cancer and it is treated with chemotherapy. Freya's parents have given us permission to share this information and allow the children at St Matthias to support their friend.

As you can imagine this came as a huge shock to her family who have had to adapt to a new way of juggling hospital treatment and understanding what this means for Freya. She is being very brave and is spending a lot of time in hospital having intense Chemotherapy and of course being looked after by her family and the nurses. It has also had a huge impact not only on Freya's siblings but also on the pupils in her class. Freya is a huge part of St Matthias, we miss her dearly and wish her all the very best for her intensive treatment. We are hoping that once she feels a little better that we might be able to set up some video calls for us to say hello and give her the encouragement that she needs in a more personal way.

When the children heard about Freya, they wanted to do something to help her and her family through this challenging time and wanted to raise some money for them and give them some lovely gifts to show how much we care and want to help.

Christmas Trees

Last year we had two Christmas Trees outside for everyone to enjoy and we offered for the children to donate a Christmas decoration to one of the trees. This was really special and festive, so we have decided to do this again this year.

There will be one at the front entrance of school for us all to enjoy as we arrive and leave school and one in the Early Years area so they can also enjoy seeing a Christmas tree as they enter and leave school. If you would like to donate one decoration, which is weather proof, we would love to hang the decoration on one of the trees. In this way it will make those Christmas trees much more of a community activity and more valued and owned by



the children of St Matthias. Imagine coming into school every day up until Christmas knowing that your decoration was hanging on the tree. The Christmas trees will be arriving on the 1st December.

Your child can wear, warm non-uniform clothes and sensible footwear to school in return for something for the present room. For example, soaps, chocolate, stationery, fragrances, jewellery, but NO Alcohol.

All items will be quarantined until the following week, where an army of volunteers will sort and set up a 'Present Room' for the children to select their gifts.

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Attendance

There are 365 days in a calendar year, 175 of them are not school days – that's plenty of time for shopping, days out, parties, holidays, appointments and visiting family and friends.

Good attendance means being in school **over 96%** of the time. In a school year, that means being in school on 183 out of the 190 school days. The table below shows class attendance statistics for this week.
